The number of South Dakota students not pursuing higher education is rising. **Nearly 40% of students do not participate in postsecondary education**, directly contrasting with the number of educated persons needed to support workforce demand.

Despite state efforts to manage tuition and fees, increasing out-of-pocket expenses prevent many qualified students from pursuing a post-secondary degree. The financial burden is even greater for adult learners, first-generation students, part-time students and new Americans. Educational barriers prevent young people from realizing their true potential and hinder South Dakota's ability to overcome workforce shortages.

Workforce demand in the health care, education and business industries is particularly high. 
Strong Values, Thriving Communities


